CIVIL AFFAIRS supports the Mission with the implementation of the Mandate (UNSCR 2387) in the areas of the Protection of Civilians, Community Dialogue and Reconciliation, and the Restoration of State Authority.

Core tasks

CIVIL AFFAIRS (CA) plays a crucial role in fostering coherence among Mission components, in partnership with the UN Country Team conducting joint activities, serving as a link between emergency relief, community engagement, and stabilization processes.



One of MINUSCA's largest sections, with **117 staff**, what distinguishes CA is its **nationwide presence, in 12 field offices and 35 military bases**, ensuring direct proximity with isolated communities.

This close community engagement allows the section to **develop local networks** and empower communities to propose concrete solutions to Central African problems.

Reconciliation

By supporting local peace agreements, the section works to ensure:

- Support to **27 GoCAR** Peace Committees.
- The free circulation of people and goods.
- The spontaneous return of IDPs and refugees.
- Reduction of agro-pastoral conflicts.
- Institutional support to the GoCAR's Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs and Reconciliation.

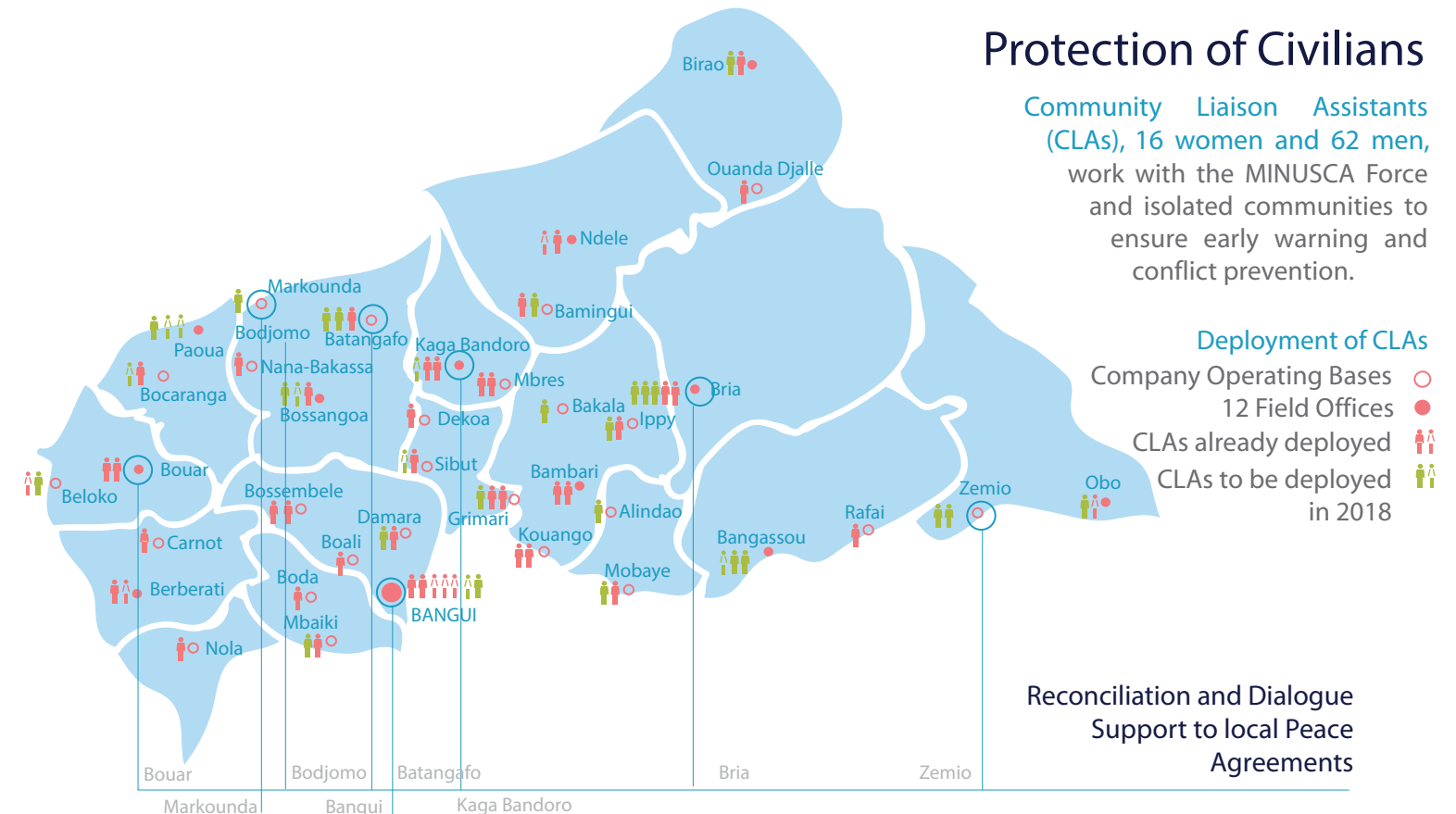

Protection of Civilians

Community Liaison Assistants (CLAs), 16 women and 62 men, work with the MINUSCA Force and isolated communities to ensure early warning and conflict prevention.

Achievements

Active in MINUSCA since 2014, Civil Affairs has been the Mission's key bridge to communities. Fostering coherence between the different Mission components under the leadership of the DSRSG-HC-RC, the section is responsible for the management of Quick Impact Projects (QIPs) for the entire Mission.



315 QIPs since 2014.

120 administrative buildings rehabilitated throughout CAR.

Support for the implementation of **8** local peace agreements.

3200 civilians mobilized via community engagement.



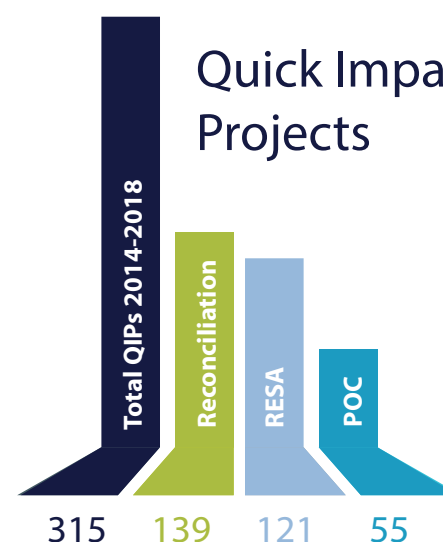
10 million USD invested in improving the lives of vulnerable communities.

Quick Impact Projects



QIPs are small-scale, low-cost projects, funded by MINUSCA, planned and implemented within a short timeframe. QIPs aim to build confidence in the Mission, its mandate and the peace process.

Restoration and Extension of State Authority

Presence of civil servants: Support the GoCAR to map civil servants in the country.

QIPs: Rehabilitation & reconstruction of administrative buildings.

Access to basic State services: Support to the GoCAR with the extension of basic social-services to all Prefectures.



Capacity building for more than 2,000 civil servants on local governance and territorial administration.

National RESA Strategy: In collaboration with UNDP, CA supports its implementation.

Redeployment: Technical and logistical support for the deployment of prefects, sub-prefects, teachers and administrative staff.
